We, at ACOE, want to salute Nate Miley, Alameda County Board of Supervisors. Supervisor Miley was first elected as an Alameda County Board of Supervisor in November 2000. He was re-elected for a second term in January 2004.

Supervisor Miley is noted for his courage, tenacity, and commitment to the children and extended families of Alameda County. He has played a leadership role with the following initiatives: East Bay Interagency Alliance; Eden Area Livability Initiative, which was initiated to create, strengthen and sustain a livable community in the urban unincorporated areas of Alameda County; Walk to School Week; Health and Wellness; and Violence Suppression in Alameda County.

Supervisor Miley was elected to the Oakland City Council in 1990. In his role as a Councilmember, he accomplished the following:

- Chaired the Public Safety Committee
- Initiated programs to clean up neighborhood blight
- Sponsored the lead abatement program
- Passed the first 100% smoke-free workplace legislation in the City of Oakland
- Sponsored legislation to stem redlining in Oakland and encourage local investment in neighborhoods
- Supported community-oriented policing with the first local substation
- Worked to reform public housing

Supervisor Miley is creative and hardworking. He tackles tough issues and fights for the health and welfare of his constituency. We are proud and pleased to honor Supervisor Miley with this Public Service Award.
